<u>March Rally</u> <u>Rocky Creek Scout Camp Landsborough</u> <u>Wednesday 14th - Monday 19th</u>

Rates: Powered sites – \$16 per night

> The campsite is located on Old Gympie Road. From the township of Landsborough (after crossing over the railway line) go straight ahead along the Maleny/Landsborough Rd and take the second road on the left (at the roundabout) - Gympie St South. Go along this road about 2kms and you will cross over the bridge at Rocky Creek and it is the next driveway on your left.



Amenities:

- Male and female septic toilets and showers (Also for the disabled)
- Hot gas showers
- All campsites have mains pressure town water supply on tap.
- Campfire drums are provided for use on the developed campsites, only dead wood on the ground may be used.

EMERGENCY DETAILS -FIRE OR MEDICAL

To seek urgent help, continual quick short blasts of a <u>whistle or car horn</u> (3 seconds on/off). Upon hearing this member are requested to proceed in an orderly manner to the site of the whistle or car horn bringing with them mobile phone, fire extinguisher, water bucket, fire blanket, torch and first aid kit **POST CODE - 4550** 1

The Rocky Creek campsite takes in an area of 120 acres (48.5 hectares). Nearly 100 acres are preserved as natural bush and wildlife sanctuary. The natural bush would be best described as tea tree (paperbark) country and is very flat with low ridges and shallow gullies. This makes bush walking easy going and very enjoyable. Numerous walking tracks criss-cross the area and are used for orienteering, bush walking, nature studies etc. The northern boundary is Rocky Creek, which is a "ribbon of rainforest" and has many varieties of palms, large trees and bamboo (not to be felled). There is a dam and two consecrated chapel sites for everyone to use. There are four bush campsites and various other established campsite areas closer to the main development area. All campsites have mains pressure town water supply on tap. There are two separate accommodation buildings, and a masonry block ablution building.



At 2.00pm on Saturday the club held an informal meeting to discuss officially supporting the state rally and those members of our club who are involved in the running of the state rally in Bundaberg.

The meeting was open to all members with an email sent out the previous week advising of the meeting.

It was agreed by all members who attended that we support the state rally.

Support for the state rally will be ratified by the committee at our next official meeting in March.

5-Ingredient Zucchini Fritters

These versatile zucchini fritters can be eaten as a light meal, served as a side dish or whipped up for brekkie on the weekend.

Serves: 4

Ingredients: 400g zucchini 1/2 cup self-raising flour 2 eggs, whisked ¹/₄ cup parmesan, finely grated 1/4 cup crumbled feta cheese 1/4 fresh parsley, chopped 1/4 cup shallots or chives, chopped 4 teaspoons olive oil 2 tablespoons of fresh dill Salt and pepper to season Lemon wedges, for serving



Methods:

1. Grate zucchini into colander and squeeze out excess moisture with hands. Transfer to bowl.


2. Stir in self-raising flour, shallots or chives, whisked eggs, parmesan, feta and parsley. Combined well and season with salt and pepper.

3. Heat two teaspoons of olive oil in frying pan over medium to high heat. Drop in two tablespoons of zucchini mixture and use the back of spoon to press into fritters. 聽Cook for two to three minute each side or until golden and cooked through. Transfer to paper towel lined plate.

4. Wipe pan down with paper towel and add remaining oil. Repeat with remaining mixture.

5. Garnish with dill and we recommend serving with lemon wedges.

Serve the zucchini fritters topped with sour cream (optional) and sliced scallions.


