# Chicken Stuffed with Mozzarella, Tomato and Basil Recipe

Servings: 2

## Ingredients

- 2 boneless skinless chicken breasts
- 8 to 10 slices mozzarella cheese
- 5 to 6 grape tomatoes; sliced in half
- Fresh basil leaves
- 2 teaspoons Italian seasoning
- Salt and Pepper
- 2 teaspoons olive oil

## Instructions

- 1. Place the chicken breasts on a cutting board. Using a sharp knife, cut slits across the chicken breast about 3/4 of the way through being careful not to cut all the way through.
- 2. Depending on the size of your chicken breast, you're going to want around 6 to 8 slits per chicken breast.
- 3. Stuff each slit with a slice of mozzarella cheese, half a grape tomato and a basil leaf.
- 4. Place the chicken breasts in a baking dish that has been coated with non-stick baking spray.
- 5. Brush each chicken breast with olive oil.
- 6. Sprinkle each chicken breast with salt, pepper and Italian seasoning.
- 7. Bake in a preheated 200°C oven for 30 minutes or until the internal temperature of the chicken reaches 70°C.

## **Recipe Notes**

Note: The quantity for tomatoes, cheese and basil will depend on how many slits you make in the boneless chicken breasts.
