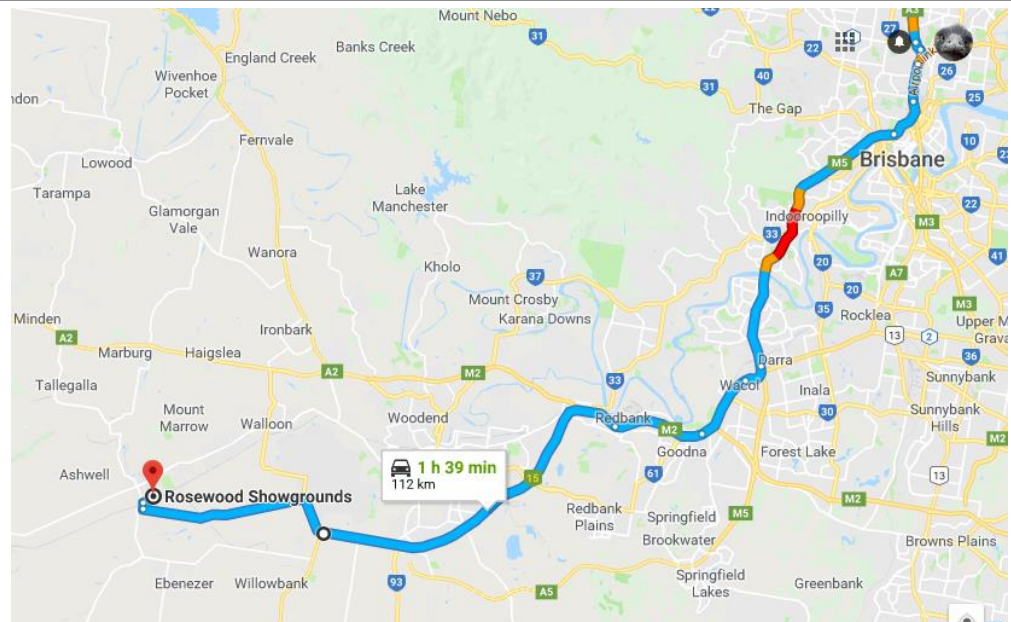

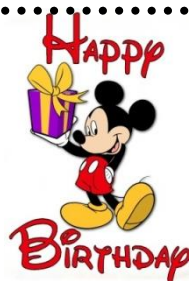

**Quick Apple Slice**

2 1/2 cups SR Flour  
1/2 tsp cinnamon  
2/3 cup sugar  
3 or 4 apples, peeled, cored & diced into 1cm chunks  
160g butter/margarine; melted & cooled  
1 egg

Sift flour & cinnamon, add sugar & apple and mix. Whisk egg into melted butter and pour into Apple mix and stir with a fork until well combined. Press firmly into lined slice tray and sprinkle with cinnamon sugar (1TB caster sugar + 1/2 tsp cinnamon) Bake at 160 fan forced oven for 30-40 mins

Perfect for school lunches or yummy served warm with cream for dessert. You can use wholemeal SR flour to make it more healthy. If you don't want to use so many apples you can substitute 1/3 cup sultanas instead of an apple.


