

Driving Directions: Take the North bound Bruce Highway to Yandina. Turn left onto the Yandina – Coolum Rd. You will turn right at the first round-about and take the 2nd exit at the 2nd round-about. Continue until you come to the 3rd round-about. Take the 2nd exit into Coolum. Head straight down to the beach. Turn left at the T-junction and the Holiday Park will be on your right (beach front) opposite McDonalds.






Take Bruce Highway to Exit 194 - Sunshine Motorway turnoff (approx. 1klm past the old Ettamoogah Pub). Follow the Sunshine Motorway (State Route 70) to Exit onto State Route 11 (Emu Mtn Rd in Peregian Springs) 3rd Exit at round-about onto Yandina Coolum Rd. Follow to the beach and turn Left at T-junction and the Holiday Park will be on your right (beach front) opposite McDonalds.




Treasurer's Report

Tasty Tuna Cutlets

- Preparation Time 20 minutes
- Baking Time 15 minutes
- Serves 2



- Ingredients 1. 5 oz. / 140 g fresh tuna
- 2. ½ cup / 75 g potatoes
- 3. ½ medium onion, finely chopped
- 4. 1 tsp / 2 g finely chopped ginger
- 5. 2 tsp / 6 g finely chopped garlic
- 6. 1 tsp / 5 ml olive oil
- 7. $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp / 3 gm salt
- 8. 1 cup / 240 ml water
- Directions
- 1. Preheat oven to 350°F / 180°C. Brush a small baking pan with ½ teaspoon / 2½ ml oil.
- 2. Boil the potatoes until they are very soft. Mash them thoroughly, either with a hand tool or in a mixer, until smooth without any lumps. Cover and set aside.
- 3. In a small shallow pan, boil the fish in 1 cup of water for about 5 minutes. In a shallow bowl, add the mashed potatoes, cooked fish, and finely chopped onions, ginger, and garlic, and blend well until you get a uniform mixture. Refrigerate for 15 minutes.
- 4. After 15 minutes, remove from the refrigerator. Make balls out of the mix, and then flatten each ball with your palm to form a cutlet-like shape.
- 5. Place the cutlets in the prepared baking dish and brush remaining oil on the tops.
- 6. Place the dish on the middle rack off the oven and bake for 15 minutes. The cutlets can be considered done when both sides are crisp and dark brown in colour.


