- Take Stanmore Rd to Beaudesert Beenleigh Rd/State Route 92 in Wolffdene 8 min (7.3 km)
- Continue on Beaudesert Beenleigh Rd. Drive to State Route 90 in Beaudesert
- At the roundabout, take the 2nd exit and stay on Beaudesert Beenleigh Rd/State Route 92
- Continue to follow Beaudesert Beenleigh Rd (13.4 km)
- Continue onto Beaudesert Nerang Rd/State Route 90
- Destination will be on the left
