Google Maps Directions Redcliffe to Crows Nest

- Merge onto M1 at Deagon
- Keep left at the fork to continue on Southern Cross Way, follow signs for Northern Suburbs/City
- Follow signs for E W Arterial Rd/City/M7 and merge onto East-West Arterial Rd
- Merge onto M3 towards lpswich
- Keep right at the fork to continue on **M5**, follow signs for Western Suburbs/Legacy Way Tunnel/ lpswich
- Use the right 2 lanes to take the M7/lpswich Mwy exit (towards lpswich/Toowoomba)
- Merge onto M7 for 4 klms
- Continue onto M2 for 5.2 klms
- Continue onto M2/National Highway 15 for 1.8 klms
- Use the left 2 lanes to take the M2/Warrego Hwy exit towards Esk/Toowoomba for 1.2 klms
- Continue onto Warrego Hwy/A2 for approx. 77klms
- Take Murphys Creek Rd, Fifteen Mile Rd and Collingwood Rd to New England Hwy/A3/State Route 85 in Hampton for approx. 26.5km (27 min)
- Turn right onto New England Hwy/A3/State Route 85 Continue to follow New England Hwy/A3 for approx. 11km (7 minutes).

Turn Left. destination will be on the right




