The second place winning domestic garden was huge, more than an acre of pristine lawns, tiered gardens complete with ferns, orchids, waterfalls & fishponds and Seiko the 'watch dog'. Ornate gazebos & beds of annuals in the shape of Australia with the different states & even a kangaroo for the International visitors. This immaculate property also had an impressive, large collection of classic cars, from a T model ford or two to a Cadillac, mustang & corvette to name a few, also on display were the owners impressive display of motoring trophies, he was a champion saloon racing car driver! Even had a mini jeep car complete with Golden Fleece petrol pump for the kids!

A complete set of several early transport dioramas were also included in one area , great for visiting school kids & tourists, proudly made by an elderly gentleman standing nearby.

Several gardens had large displays of succulents & cacti as well as clivia of every colour, orchids, annuals & perennials all a riot of colour & feast for the eyes. Our next stop was the spectacular queens gardens, it did not disappoint. Every flower of every colour was planted in perfect harmony or to astound with vibrant contrast in layered beds or under huge shady trees, a place to sit in the shade & relax, watch children play or just contemplate the universe!! If that's your thing?

Azaleas & rhododendrons were in their glory as were the wisteria, roses & flowering blossom trees in majestic springtime beauty. Cool areas were planted with orchids, ferns, clivia and pansies, all manner of shade loving plants.

We also visited laurel bank gardens, to wander & enjoy & have a bite to eat or sit & listen to the free concerts or jazz groups playing at various locations throughout the amazing gardens. We visited the grand champion garden, on acres of land, this truly was a majestic work of art, with formal gardens, sweeping lawns & terraces, shady ancient avocado trees forming a natural shaded area for ferns, clivia and quiet areas to sit & rest, artworks & mosaics were scattered throughout this magnificent garden and it was bordered by a large chicken run & numerous vegie gardens. It was not hard to see why this was the standout winner!!!!



We then were transported into the city at 3 pm to see the "Carnival of flowers" street parade with dozens of colourful floats, brass bands, dance schools, armed services, emergency services, sporting groups and an amazing array of ethnic groups in traditional dress & playing traditional music, showed the true meaning of multiculturalism. 1 1/2 hours went quickly and the troops had been instructed to meet back at the bus after the parade, which we dutifully did and waited, the driver & hostess were nowhere to be seen! A credit to each & everyone of them , hours months & years of hard work proudly on display by these dedicated green thumbs, some well into their 80's.

With banks of petunias & annuals in huge ancient timber water troughs & ancient tree stumps turned into organic planters cascading blooms of every colour, shape & variety it was a miracle to behold the work of these humble country folk. Plants of all varieties flourished under their care. Bravo to all!




