

Unique Spray for Mosquitoes

The best way of getting rid of mosquitoes is Listerine, the original medicinal type. The Dollar Store-type works, too. I was at a deck party awhile back, and the bugs were having a ball biting everyone. A man at the party sprayed the lawn and deck floor with Listerine and the little demons disappeared. The next year I filled a 4-ounce spray bottle and used it around my chair whenever I saw mosquitoes and voila! that worked as well. It worked at a picnic where we sprayed the area around the food table, the children's swing area and the standing water nearby. During the summer, I don't leave home without it.

OUR FRIEND'S COMMENTS: I tried this on my deck and around all of my doors. It works - in fact, it killed them instantly.

I bought my bottle from Target and it cost me \$1.89. It really doesn't take much, and it is a big bottle, too; so it is not as expensive to use as the can of spray you buy that doesn't last 30 **minutes. So, try** this, please. It will last a couple of days.

Don't spray directly on a wood door (like your front door), but spray around the frame. Spray around the window frames and even inside the dog house if you have one. Also can be used to dab any bites you receive. It will stop the itching quicker and go away faster.

SUGGESTED EQUIPMENT FOR RALLIES

- 15 amp power lead (20 metres in length).
- Cord lock or similar protective cover for joining power leads.
- Wheel chocks and levelling blocks for uneven sites (May need several blocks for some sites at showgrounds. Timber off cuts cheapest an lightest).
- Timber or block for jockey wheel and under van legs.
- Two lengths of food grade water hose. (15 metre and 7metre lengths).
- Ropes and pegs for tying down caravan awing.
- Hammer.
- Spirit Level (For taking van levels, refrigerators need to be level to run efficiently). Note 'T' level glued to 'A' frame most efficient as that is where you wind jockey wheel.
- Y piece tap fitting to split venue water source.
- Hose joiners at least two.
- Good quality snap on hose fittings.
- Tap fittings to suit 3/4 and 1".
- Tap washers.
- Thread tape.
- Sullage hose (at least 5 metres).
- Shovel or folding spade.
- Small ladder.

• Suitable caravan jack. Scissor type is excellent as they are low profile and cheap.

- Set of spanners and screw drivers. Carry in tow vehicle.
- Good quality chairs.
- Small table.
- Shade cloth to attach to awning to provide protection from sun. You can sew this easily.
- Suitable ground cover for under awning. Do not use shade cloth on concrete as it creates a slippery surface.
- Spare bulbs for inside and outside caravan, including running lights.
- Old towels to use as water mops etc.
