**B**lackbutt is a rural town of about 560 people, 115 km north-west of central Brisbane. It is situated at the north-eastern end of the Blackbutt Range. The name was given by a Crown surveyor in 1909, using the common trade name for various species of dark barked eucalypts. Timber harvesting was Blackbutt's main early industry. The nearby Tarong Power Station provides a source of local employment, together with local businesses, and small-scale crop and orchard concerns. A golf club was established in 1963. There are a hotel and a motel, a visitor information centre, a State primary school, five churches, a public hall, general store, convenience store, sports centre and a sawmill. There are a local doctor, chemist, hardware, butcher & fire brigade. **Places to visit** –Yarraman State Forrest, Emu Creek, Oasis fruit & Veg, Woodcutters pancake shop.

The rally coordinator will require your booking by Friday 6<sup>th</sup> May 2011, please reply <u>if you are</u> attending <u>or not</u> attending. Long leads, long hoses + "Y" connections & levellers will be required. Dump point. Suggest you bring drinking water. Showers & toilets + disabled (rated as good). Cost \$ 7.00 per person per night, <u>cash</u> will be required.

<u>TARP SIDES ONLY will be required & disc bowls etc.</u> Carriers— L.Brearley, R.Vasyli (sides), J.Mackenzie (stock) if you are not attending please arrange alternate carrier ASAP.

#### Directions: - (You may experience hold up due to road being repaired after landslide)

**D**riving from Brisbane via Caboolture. Travel on the motorway/Bruce Highway, follow the signs to Kilcoy & Kingaroy, when you reach Kilcoy take the turn-off to Kingaroy (D'Aguilar Highway) Blackbutt is approximately 45 minutes from Kilcoy. Turn right at the Monument into Bowman's Road & follow to showgrounds.

**D**riving from Brisbane <u>via Ipswich Road</u>. Take the Toowoomba turn-off onto the Warrego Highway, Take the Esk Turn-off onto the Brisbane Valley Highway and this will take you through Fernvale, Esk, Toogoolawah and Harlin. Turn left at the end of Brisbane Valley (towards Moore & Yarraman) this is the D'Aguilar Highway and Blackbutt is approximately 20 minutes away. Turn right at the Monument into Bowman's Road & follow to showgrounds.

**B**EWARE!!!!!We strongly suggest you keep a check of your Speedo especially travelling through Moore, as it is a known RADAR ZONE.

#### Tyre & Wheel Information:-

All members are reminded that they should have their wheels on their vans balanced. An unbalanced wheel puts extra strain onto the vans bearings. Also you should be rotating your tyres by including the spare so all get similar usage. This can assist in prolonging the life span of the tyres. Lastly you should cover your exposed tyres (old piece of fibro is excellent) to the sun when the van is in storage. Many tyre failures are a consequence (over time) of not being protected whilst sitting at home waiting for the next trip."

#### Corner Moulds:-

Sealing and around corner moulds - windows, doors etc. should be checked for cracks or holes which may allow water to enter and rot framing or lining sheets.

NOTE: After a good shower of rain check the inside of the van for water leaks. Never leave your van unattended for months on end.
