Turn left onto Spencer Rd. 1.02KM

Turn left onto Stringer Rd. nearest town: Kilkivan

Bear left onto Rossmore Rd. 1.23KM nearest town: **Kilkivan**

Arrive at destination

The Kilkivan and District Museum and information centre in the main street features extensive displays which pay tribute to the regions early pioneers at the museum. The country town features parks and restored historical buildings, a tribute to the town's golden heyday. Kilkivan has antique stores, a historical walk and a unique cafe and B&B is housed in the town's original bank.

With strong historical links to the old coach and stock routes, Kilkivan is one of the few towns on the <u>Bicentennial National Trail</u>. A stone plaque commemorates the opening of the trail in 1988.

MOUNT CLARA Chimney, thought to be the oldest surviving mining industry chimney in Queensland, also among the first built, is located 13 kilometres by road outside town, and is now conserved as a tourist attraction. It is not easy to get to.

Kilkivan Folk Museum

There is a folk museum in Kilkivan which is open from Tuesday to Saturday from 12.00pm - 3.00pm. It can be opened at other times by appointment.


