#### Winter Warmer.....Sticky Date Pudding

#### Caramel Sauce

250g chopped dates
1 ¼ cups water
125g butter, chopped
1 tsp ground ginger
1 tsp bicarbonate of soda
1/4 cup caster sugar
2 x 60 eggs,
1 ¼ cups SR Flour

tblsp cornflour
 cup water
 cup firmly packed brown sugar
 125g butter, chopped
 tsp vanilla essence

#### METHOD

Combine dates, water, butter and ginger in a pan, stir over heat until butter is melted. Bring to the boil, boil one minute, remove from heat and stir in soda. Cool slightly.

Stir in sugar, lightly beaten eggs, and sifted flour and mix until combined. Pour mixture into greased and base-lined 1.5 litre capacity microwave safe pudding bowl. Cover and cook on HIGH for 14 - 15 minutes until just set in centre. Stand covered for two minutes the turn out on to serving plate. Serve pudding topped with Caramel Sauce.

#### CARAMEL SAUCE

Blend cornflour with the water in a saucepan then stir in brown sugar, butter and vanilla. Stir over low heat until sugar and butter is melted, then increase heat and continue stirring until the sauce boils and thickens.
