<u>Next Month's Rally – Cunungra Sports and Recreation Reserve</u> <u>Wednesday 14th to Mondayv 19th February 2012</u>

Canungra Sports & Recreation Reserve, Coburg Road, Canungra.

Canungra is situated at the foothills of the McPherson Rang. The name is an aboriginal expression to describe a small owl. Timber cutters came to the area in 1860 and the Lahey brothers established their saw mill here in the 1880's. The first show was held at the showground in 1938. The Land Training Centre, established in 1942 trains troops in jungle warfare and the building complex was named the Kokoda Barracks. The Kokoda Walk links the barracks with Broadbeach.

Activities& Attractions: Enjoy wine tasting and lunch at local wineries. Walk the Lahey Historic Tramway. Explore the Museum of Australian Military Intelligence. Visit Binna Burra (29km) or O'Reilly's Rainforest Retreat (36km). Meals available at Canungra Hotel – Ph. 5543 5233 or RSL – Ph. 5543 5066

Directions: Follow the M1 south to Beenleigh, take the Beenleigh South exit (No.35) and cross over the M1 then turn right into Main Street which then becomes Milne Street. At the next roundabout turn left into Beaudesert-Beenleigh Road (Route 92) continue on this and once past the Tamborine Mountain turnoff watch out for the Mundoolan Connection Road, turn left into Mundoolan Connection Road (Route 90). Keep following Route 90 into Canungra, turn right into Lamington National Park Road, then right into Showground Road, the showgrounds entrance is on your left.

Facilities: Undercover area and power, limited water outlets. Bring long hoses to 'piggy back' from van to van. Drinking water/full water tanks required. Long extension leads necessary.

Site Fees: \$10.00 per person per night. Medical: Canungra Family Practice, 49 Christie St., Canungra. Ph. 5443 5688. Hospital: Gold Coast Hospital, Nerang St., Southport (36klm) Dogs: On leads, but not in communal areas The Rally Coordinator will require your booking by 5th March. THE TARP – Carriers please note the tarp will NOT be REQUIRED, BUT 2 X FLURO LIGHTS + EXTENSION LEAD & POWER BOARD WILL BE REQUIRED TO LIGHT COVERED AREA PROVIDED.

I hope everyone is keeping well & looking forward to seeing you all at Canungra in March.


