Established in 1992, Ivory's Rock Conference Centre has been developed in harmony with the natural bushland, winning awards for environment and design. The Centre is located on 800 hectares of natural forest and parklands and is home to abundant wildlife, with many species of birds and wallabies including the endangered Brush Tailed Rock Wallaby. Located in the centre of the Peak Mountains, bushwalking tracks afford views over coastal and inland regions. The natural beauty of the area includes a large lake, billabong and attractive creeks and rock pools. Places to visit; Ipswich & surrounding area. Some powered sites are available for caravans and motor homes, with shared bathroom facilities.

Site booked-Sandy Creek Campgrounds- well grassed with power, 2 unisex toilets & 3 ensuites, rating/ good. You are required to bring full tanks of water as there are no individual water outlets (There's one tap on amenities building) Long leads & levellers will be required.

The rally coordinator will require your booking by Friday 1st July 2011, please reply if <u>you will or will not</u> be attending this rally. Cost \$18.00 per van per night, cash please.

TARP & Components;

The tarp **will** be required for this rally. If you are <u>not</u> attending please arrange alternate carrier ASAP. Carriers-Eric Byng, D.Broadley, Alan White, Ron Vasyli, Peter Crowe & stock John Mackenzie.

Directions –Merge onto Gateway M/way/M1 via the ramp to Gold Coast. Continue to follow Gateway M/way-partial toll road. Keep **right** at fork & **merge** onto Logan M/way, take exit onto Ipswich M/way, continue onto Cunningham Hwy/National H/way (signs for Warwick) take Ipswich-Boonah Rd/State Route 93 exit toward Boonah/Ipswich. Merge onto Ipswich-Boonah Rd/State Route 93, continue to follow Ipswich-Boonah Rd, turn left onto Mount Flinders Rd, Peak Crossing - look for conference centre sign, travel 3klms sealed road (night drivers -watch out for tree in middle of the road) then 1 klms dirt road, good condition, destination will be on the right (gate should be open)
