Nambour is a thriving regional town nestled between the hinterland & the beach, just a short drive from Montville or an easy cruise to the beautiful Sunshine Coast beaches. Nambour has beautiful parks, a waterfall, the museum, the RSL Club. .

<u>Directions</u>: Travel Bruce H'way/M1. Take the exit towards Blackall Range Tourist Drive/ Tourist Driver 23/State Route 10/ Nambour Bli Bli Road. At the roundabout, take the 2nd exit onto Bli Bli Rd/Tourist Driver 23. At the lights turn left onto Coronation Ave. Take the 1st left on to Showgrounds Rd.

<u>Requirements</u>: Long leads, hoses + Y pieces may be required (It is Council requirements that leads are tested.)

<u>Amenities</u>: Showers & Toilets (if you own ensuite tents & portable toilets it is a good idea to bring them to use at night time)

Power & Water: Available (15 AMP leads & 10 AMP ext. & light leads)

<u>Things to do</u>: Big Pineapple Growers Market – Saturday 6.30 am Museums, Heritage, Cinema, Art Galleries, Sunshine Castle (Bli Bli) Bellingham Maize (Tanawha) Ginger Factory (Yandina)Fairhill Native Plants & Botanic Gardens (Yandina) Hotels, McDonalds, Ski 'N'Surf Cable Water Ski Park (Bli Bli) Wineries etc

The first day was to Mt Warning and it started out with blue skies. We travelled via Nerang and after one 'pit stop' arrived at Mt Warning just on lunch time, local time. Once we left the Sunshine State the weather closed in a bit with a couple of light showers. After setting up we piled into two cars and went for a drive around Mt Warning in fine weather, although clouds were covering some of the mountain peaks. It turned out to be





a great drive through rain forest on back roads, to Clarrie Hall dam and views over the Tweed Valley and occasional views of Mt Warning. Arrived back just in time for happy hour, initially under a shady tree then under an annex as the rain started.



There was enough rain overnight to sink any prospect of the adventurous few climbing Mt Warning, so we packed up and left just after nine. It was fine with occasional showers as we headed off along the road to Nimbin. There were certainly plenty of 'pot' holes approaching Nimbin and a few larger ones leaving as Warren discovered. We stopped at the village of Goolmangar as Warren had a flat tyre on the car. After changing the tyre we had some 'friendly' locals complaining about us stopping on the grass verge of the road!



Arrived at Lake Ainsworth and what a great spot we had looking out over the lake. After a couple of light showers the weather cleared and it was a fantastic afternoon. We explored the beautiful coast line then had a swim in the lake before happy hour followed by a walk to the local bowls club for a \$10 steak. A great day.





The next day we went our various ways to Byron Bay and Ballina checking out the local attractions including the Ballina Maritime Museum and Macadamia Castle.
