

Have you checked your tyres recently?

This is a warning to those of you that have not checked your caravan tyres recently.

RACQ - Tyres can deteriorate with age. Even a tyre that's been sitting as a spare wheel for years, that's never been used and has plenty of tread could be ready for retirement.

Heat, sunlight, ozone and other environmental conditions can all cause deterioration of the rubber compounds. In service this can lead to tyre failures.

Some industry experts suggest that worn out or not, a tyre may have passed its useful life after about five to six years.

A production date code is usually moulded into the tyre sidewall.

I had looked at my van tyres some time ago & noticed that the production code indicated that they were produced in 2006. The code below indicates that the tyre was produced in the 26th week of 2006 (2606).



As usual I gave this some consideration trying to deciding which tyre which branch etc. I could not decide so will give it some more thought & would leave it until later.

This proved to be the wrong & potentially dangerous decision as we found out returning from the February rally at Boyd's Bay.



Lucky we have a dual axle van and were close to the Yatala exit so were able to get off the highway & change it safely
No damage to the van or rim but needless to say the next week I purchased five new Dunlop SP175 tyres.

So I would suggest if you have not checked <u>ALL</u> your tyres for wear & age recently you do so as soon as possible.
