
The family in the photo survived the Feb1893 floods in Fernvale, by climbing a tree. The river was 10 mls wide.

Fernvale is a small town in South East Queensland. Approximately 60 kilometres west of Brisbane, it lies on the Brisbane River, at the southern end of the region of Somerset.

The Brisbane River around Fernvale is home to a diverse fauna, including the Queensland lungfish, platypus, red-claw yabby and the freshwater mussel. Other common native animals include the echidna, koala, red-necked wallaby. The feral European fox is also common.
