Next Month's Rally – Kilkivan Bush Camp Wednesday 16th to Monday 21st June 2010







Kilkivan Bush Camp is nestled in the foothills of the Oakview State Forest next to Fat Hen Creek. Rossmore Park is known for its unspoilt tranquillity and abundant birdlife, two & half hours/ 224 klms from Brisbane, sealed road six kms off the Wide Bay Highway. Close by is the Prophet Gold mine where you can pan for gold. Mt.Clara copper smelter is up the road & you can visit the Fat Hen Farm (olives & crayfish) it is a short drive to the Mudlo Gap Conservation Park, Kinbombi Falls. Kilkivan has a good Butcher, Newsagent, Take-away, RACQ garage, P.O; Counter meals are available at the local pub. There is a Bowls & Golf club, in Goomeri visit Cheeseworld & browse "The Emporium" for country clothing. You will need long leads & hoses, the caravans sites are well grassed, good amenities with hot showers. Pets are welcome & open fires permitted, some wood is available or bring your own to help out. For those without a Caravan there are very basic huts, camp kitchen & shared amenities.


COST per van per powered site: \$18.00 per night

Cyril, Peter and I went on another venue appraisal mission the other week. We visited Dayboro show grounds, Rocky Creek scout camp (Landsborough) and Beerwah sports ground. All have been approved as inclusions into our 'Approved venue list'. All have their pluses and minuses but for me Beerwah had to be the stand out with magnificent new facilities and well maintained grounds but in saying that the scout camp was a close second. 


Hello fellow caravanners another successful rally with 15 caravans attending Lake Dyer.

Tyre & Wheel Information;

All members are reminded that they should have their wheels on their vans balanced.

An unbalanced wheel puts extra strain onto the vans bearings. Also you should be rotating your tyres by including the spare so all get similar usage. This can assist in prolonging the life span of the tyres. Lastly you should cover your exposed tyres (old piece of fibro is excellent) to the sun when the van is in storage. Many tyre failures are a consequence (over time) of not being protected whilst sitting at home waiting for the next trip.
