The KILCOY SHOWGROUND/RACE CLUB (upgraded Jan. 2013) is a well-appointed area with 15amp power being supplied through a total of 51 outlets on power poles that are accessed by sturdy platforms.

It has, adjacent to the Grandstand, a large spectator shelter structure, open to the East (towards the race track) and a reasonably covered Western side (can be cool). The grounds slope away from the oval to the lagoons providing good drainage in wet weather. The ground has lush grass and is reasonably even - but with no shade over the sites. On our previous visit, temperatures reached 42°. It is cold in winter at night. Torches are necessary for night toilet visits. There are waterholes/creeks on the western and northern sides. There is considerable flexibility & room as to vans parking. It has both showers and shower-toilets with:-

Women-3 showers & 6 toilets: Men-3 showers , 4 toilets & 1 urinal. Under the grandstand is a large enclosed room with trestle tables, chairs and limited kitchen with hot-water washup facilities.


