- 2. That it is worthwhile making existing facilities available showgrounds; scout camps for use to caravan clubs at an attractive rate.
- 3. That It is worthwhile improving existing facilities to bring more Caravan Clubs into the area tempted by an attractive rate and facilities with a guarantee of repeat trade.
- 4. That it is <u>worthwhile creating</u> facilities to bring Caravan Clubs into the area again, at an attractive


