The park has power to the majority of caravan sites; there are toilet & shower blocks that are cleaned daily and 16 smallish cabins to stay in. There is a butcher, convenience store and 3 fish and chip shops across the road and it is literally about 10 meters from the beach. A beach Walkway is provided allowing guests to walk right onto the beach. Free wireless internet. Sorry NO dogs allowed. Surf Club next door to park.
