
Safety Tips

Fire Extinguishers are required by law to be carried in all types of caravans and they must be in a serviceable condition. First tip is, do you know where yours is? And a Fire Blanket.

Power leads to caravans must be rated at 240 volts - 15 amps and under no circumstances should a 10 amp lead or an adaptor lead be used instead. There are specialised electrical apparatus available for connecting caravans to 10 amp electrical outlets. After plugging in the "socket end" to the caravan, you should always play out the excess lead over the ground so as <u>not</u> to leave it in a coil.
