



15TH NATIONAL CARAVAN RALLY – ROCKHAMPTON 2013.

Jim and I left a week early and headed to Rocky where we stayed with relatives before going into the Showgrounds on Saturday the 21st Sept.

After lunch I went to the Office to help with the sign in process, and we were kept busy with the workers who were on site early getting the grounds ready for the influx of Caravans.

Once again it was great to meet so many people we have met over the last 5 State Rallies.

On Sunday some of the Queenslanders started arriving, and we were kept busy in the office getting them all signed in.

The bulk of the Caravans arrived on Monday with the 1st van arriving outside the gates at 2.30am. they were certainly the early birds of the Rally. By mid-morning the Caravans were lined up 3 deep at the gate waiting for their turn to be taken to their sites, the rally Marshalls were certainly kept busy and of course after setting up they all headed to the office to sign in. The rest of the Peninsula Vans had arrived just before lunch and were spread all over the showgrounds.

Day 2 Tuesday was busy with the start of the tours and lots of seminars, craft lessons and other and entertainment available for those who wanted to indulge. Each day there was a vast choice of things to do with line dancing, Drag racing, Disc Bowls and many other choices available. There was something for everyone.

The opening ceremony was held on Tuesday night with the main hall being a very colourful place with so many different Club shirts. The Banners and Flags were already hanging in groups from the roof, and there were a lot of them too .We were welcomed and then a representative from each club entering the hall carrying a flag with the club name on it. Les had that Honour for us. After the official welcome and the opening ceremony, we were entertained by Rheanna Leschke & Co. a family group of father and 2 daughters who were very good.

Wednesday dawned bright and sunny, and again there was plenty of choice of activities to fill your time. I even went to Bingo, didn't win, but enjoyed myself.

The areas of the showgrounds were marked with a letter of the alphabet, and each area had a Street Host, who was there to help those in their area. The Street Hosts put on street Sausage Sizzles, Breakfasts and lunches, which got everyone together and we all got to meet the other campers in our area.

We Peninsula people did our own thing, with drives around Rocky, Bus trips, Craft and Seminars being attended at different times. I spent a bit of time in the office folding some of the 10.000 raffle tickets.

October 1 was the last day, with a lot of activities still available. An Oktoberfest was held in one of the pavilions, this was enjoyed by all.

At 6.00 pm we all assembled in the hall for the drawing of the Monster Raffle, a total of 144 prizes. I was lucky and won 2 prizes, and Les won 1 prize.

This was followed by the closing ceremony, during which a donation of rugs, beanies, teddy bears and knitted clown was handed over to the Red Cross for distribution to those who need them in the Rocky area. The big donation of the night was to the Flying Doctors, which is the charity of choice for C.C.C.Q. the cheque handed over was for \$20,000.oo. An amazing amount, which was gratefully accepted by the R.F.D.S.

After the speeches, the National rally flag was handed over to the organizing committee from Canberra for the 16th National rally to be held there in 2016.

Our club had mixed success, with Warren and Elaine winning a lucky van prize.

Eric is now the National Champion Club Drag Racer. He was a late entry, and surpassed in his endeavours, defeating all before him. Well done Eric we are proud of you.

George was not well during the rally, it was thought that the weather was affecting him, but that was not so. **George** was taken to hospital where they it was discovered that he had an abscess and was operated that night to clear the infection. George and Maryanne were bought back to Brisbane by Care Flight, and their car and van by RACQ.
