
- The usual amenities apply.

Total Fire Ban: Fires are not permitted in the Park or foreshore. This includes BBQ's that use briquettes or timber for fuel. Only gas and electric BBQ's are permitted in the Park. Remember there is a total fire ban in Tin Can Bay – massive fines apply.

It is a quiet park bordered by bush, abundant with bird and wildlife. Spacious well grassed powered sites, or with concrete slabs, En-suite sites available also. In-ground swimming pool with beach entry suitable for wheel-chair access. A short 5 min stroll to safe water.

Within walking distance to shopping centre. IGA and Woolworths in area. Morning dolphin feeding at Norman Point. Recreational activities in the area include, golf, bowls, fishing, bush & foreshore walks or bike trails, T.V. cables and dump points.

HOW TO GET THERE - Take the Bruce Hwy to Gympie. Turn right onto Cootharaba Rd/State Route 15 and follow to Tin Can Bay. View map to find Travelly St.

To seek urgent help, continual quick short blasts of a <u>whistle or car horn</u> (3 seconds on/off). Upon hearing this members are requested to proceed in an orderly manner to the site of the whistle or car horn bringing with them mobile phone, fire extinguisher, water bucket, fire blanket, torch and first aid kit




