


Origins of the Town- Richard Smith tendered to set up a cattle run on the east bank of the Mary River in 1850. At the time Mrs Smith was reading Sir Walter Scott's novel "Kenilworth" and she decided to name the property "Kenilworth" after the novel. The town was surveyed off Kenilworth Station in 1921 and took the name of the Station. Kenilworth is a small town, with a population of less than 300, in the beautiful upper Mary Valley Country, behind the Blackall Range.

DIRECTIONS: Join the Bruce hwy M1, just south of Burpengary. Stay on this road past Nambour until you reach the slip road on your left at the Eumundi exit. Take this slip road & at the top of the rise you will come to a roundabout. At this roundabout take the second exit it will take you on to Eumundi road west, route no 22. Don't go around the roundabout & take the third exit, this will take you over the bridge & into Eumundi. Continue on this road it becomes the Eumundi Kenilworth road, still route 22. Keep on this road until you reach the outskirts of Kenilworth. At the junction of the Kenilworth Brooloo, route 51 turn left. This becomes Elizabeth Street, travel through Kenilworths Main Street (past the shops) & you will see the showgrounds on your left. Turn left into the second entrance (Swimming pool) - The alternate route is too hilly for towing caravans.
