# How to get there:

# From Redcliffe to Kalbar 1 hr 32 mins (118km)

Head south on Oxley Rd/State Route 27 towards Anzac Ave/State Route 71 Slight right onto Oxley Ave, continue onto Hornibrook Esplanade/State Route 27 Continue straight onto Houghton Hwy/State Route 26/State Route 27 Continue to follow State Route 26, Keep right, Keep right at the fork, follow signs for M1 and merge onto M1. Keep left at the fork to continue on Southern Cross Way, Follow signs for Northern Suburbs/City. Take EW Arterial Rd exit towards M7/City Keep left, follow signs for EW Arterial Rd/City/M7 and merge onto East-West Arterial Rd. Continue onto Airport Link (Toll Road). Take exit onto M3 towards Ipswich. Keep right at the fork to continue on M5, follow signs for Western Suburbs/Legacy Way Tunnel/Ipswich (Toll Road). Keep right to stay on M5. Take M7/Ipswich Mwy exit on the right towards Ipswich/ Toowoomba, Merge onto M7. Continue onto M2.

Continue onto National Hwy 15

Take Ipswich-Boonah Rd/State Route 93 ramp to Boonah/Ipswich. Turn left onto Ipswich Boonah Rd/State Route 93 Turn right onto Flinders St, continue onto Warrill View Peak Crossing Road Continue straight onto Kalbar Peak Crossing Rd, Continue onto Munbilla Rd, continue onto George Street, **Kalbar**.

To seek urgent help, continual quick short blasts of a whistle or car horn (3 seconds on/off).

Upon hearing this, members are requested to proceed in an orderly manner to the site of the whistle or car horn bringing with them mobile phone, fire extinguisher, water bucket, fire blanket, torch and first aid kit where available.

It has recommended that members have a Emergency booklet, which is available from most chemist, displayed in your RV to assist Ambulance staff etc. in case of an emergency. This information should include any Medical Conditions, medications & ICE contact/s.

This information can also be stored in your smart phone for those times you are out & about.
