Nanango is nestled in the South Burnett Region of QLD 2 ½ hours North West of Brisbane. Nanango is the home of the Tarong Power Station as well as having a rich agricultural history. The showgrounds is set on 35 acres in the heart of Nanango with approximately 700 sites. Not all sites are powered. There are some basic facilities, including showers, toilets, 2 dump points. There are 4 amenities units, 3 with shower facilities including disabled access. Gates are locked each night, so if you are planning on any night time activities, be mindful you may be locked out upon your return.

Head west on Anzac Ave/State Route 71 towards the intersection and keep right to continue on Anzac Ave/State Route 26/State Route 71
At the roundabout turn right and continue onto Deception Bay Rd
Turn right to merge onto the M1
Take exit 152B for State Route 85 towards Kilcoy

Continue onto Caboolture Bypass/D'Aguilar Hwy/State Route 85

To seek urgent help, continual quick short blasts of a whistle or car horn (3 seconds on/off).

Upon hearing this members are requested to proceed in an orderly manner to the site of the whistle or car horn bringing with them mobile phone, fire extinguisher, water bucket, fire blanket, torch and first aid kit where available.

It has recommended that members have a Emergency booklet, which is available from most chemist, displayed in your RV to assist Ambulance staff etc. in case of an emergency. This information should include any Medical Conditions, medications & ICE contact/s.

This information can also be stored in your smart phone for those times you are out & about.

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
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
Coolum had so much on offer - be it a stroll along the beach or plunging into the surf, enjoying the wonderful coastline or just climbing mountains for the more adventurous

#### **CONSTITUTION & BY-LAWS**

#### **CONSTITUTION**

#### **BY-LAWS**

**28.** The management committee may recommend making, amending or repealing by-laws, not inconsistent with these rules, for the internal management of the association, which would then be decided by a vote of the members at a general meeting of the association.

#### **ALTERATION OF RULES**

- **29.** (1) Subject to the Associations Incorporation Act 1981, these rules may be amended, repealed or added to by a special resolution carried at a special general meeting.
  - (2) However an amendment, repeal or addition is valid only if it is registered by the chief executive.

#### **BY-LAWS**

#### **FUTURE BY-LAWS**

- **50.** The necessity to forge ahead with updated and progressive by-laws will require amendments from time to time.
  - (a) All agreed changes/additions as decided at a general meeting and documented in the minutes, will be issued by the Secretary to the members in the form of the relevant by-law page with the amendment date at the bottom of the page.
  - (b) All By-Laws enacted are also to be publicised in the association's newsletter in the first available issue after enactment.
