

# Samford Showgrounds 12-18 October 2022 40 Showgrounds Drive, Highvale

### Location

The Samford region lies to the northwest of Brisbane and is made up of Samford Village and Samford Valley. A picturesque and hilly area, Samford was first settled in the mid-1850s and is now a place many hobby farmers call home, being one of the closest semi-rural acreage townships to Brisbane

### **Directions**

48 min (45 km) from Redcliffe to Samford Showgrounds.

Take Oxley Ave, Hornibrook Esplanade (State Route 27), exit to Bracken Ridge Rd / Hoyland St / Strathpine Rd (State Route 58) / Gympie Rd

Exit to Kremzow Rd Brendale, Left into South Pine Rd (State Route 28) right into South Pine Rd

Turn right Samford onto Eatons Crossing Rd

Turn left onto Mount Samson Rd/State (Route 22)

Turn right into on Gibbons Rd/Greggs Rd then left into Mount Orelly Rd

  mostly flat trail (also known as Samford to Ferny Grove Cycle Link) is well-maintained and
  clearly sign-posted. Perfect for a cycling adventure, or hike. The Samford Conservation
  Park's Lomandra Day-Use Area carpark is an ideal starting point for exploring the Samford Valley Rail Trail

- Lake Samsonvale (north of Samford) for canoeing and kayaking from Forgan Cove, walking tracks (Bullocky Rest) fishing (by permit only).



### **Cheese Ball Recipe**

### Ingredients:

250gm tub of Philadelphia Cream Cheese (the 'light' version won't work)

1 medium Onion lightly chopped

1/2 jar Gherkin Relish

250gm grated Cheese

To seek urgent help, continual quick short blasts of a whistle or car horn (3 seconds on/off).

Upon hearing this, members are requested to proceed in an orderly manner to the site of the whistle or car horn bringing with them mobile phone, fire extinguisher, water bucket, fire blanket, torch and first aid kit where available.

It has been recommended that members have a Emergency booklet, which is available from most chemist, displayed in your RV to assist Ambulance staff etc. in case of an emergency. This information should include any medical conditions, medications & I.C.E. contact/s.


