











Location and History:

Kilkivan is located 229 km north of Brisbane via the Bruce and Wide Bay Highways. It is 50 km north-west from Gympie.

Kilkivan was first inhabited by the indigenous Wakka Wakka people of the area..

The town was first settled by Europeans in the 1840s. Queensland's first gold discovery was at Kilkivan in 1852 and subsequent findings escalated into a gold rush in the 1860s. Today the main industry in the district is beef cattle followed by dairying, forestry and

The Kilkivan Great Horse Ride has been held annually in April since 1986. Up to 1,000 horses and riders start from five points around Kilkivan and travel 20-30 kilometres through some of the most picturesque countryside and along parts of the National Trail to Kilkivan for the Grand Parade down the main street. In 1988 the Queensland opening of the National Trail was incorporated into the ride and the legendary late R M Williams was among the riders who participated.

Directions:

Head north on the Bruce Highway, stay on this road until approx. 10km north of Gympie and take the first exit at the roundabout which is the Wide Bay Highway, route 49. Stay on this road for approximately 30km and look for Rossmore Road on your left. The camp is about 6 km down this road, number 577.

Things to do at the rally:

- Kilkivan has antique stores, a historical walk, a general store and cafés plus a German Coffee Shop. Also housed in the town's original bank.is an Expresso Bar and B&B.
- One Mile Creek meanders through the town and Fat Hen Creek passes though the campground.
- The Kilkivan & District Museum (Tuesday-Friday) is also the town's Visitor Information Centre which is located in the main street of Bligh. Apart from the actual museum, there are eight buildings including an early business premises; a railway fettler's cottage; a railway cream shed; an outside pan toilet; a slab laundry and a slab shed constructed using slabs from many historic homesteads; a stockman's hut and the Oakview Forestry Barracks which houses a bottle and mineral display. It is open from Tuesday to Saturday from 10.00am 3.00pm.
- The Mount Clara chimney of Mount Clara Copper Smelter, thought to be the oldest surviving mining industry chimney in Queensland, and also among the first to have been built, is located 13 kilometres outside town.
- The Kilkivan to Kingaroy Rail Trail follows the old railway line between the two towns. It is 88 kms long and passes seven towns along the way. The trail from Kilkivan to Murgon is unsealed. The first creek crossing is of Coppermine Creek about 2.5 kms south west of Kilkivan. A low level bridge was opened across Wide Bay Creek in October 2021

Rae volunteered to be the club photographer recording our rallies and events for many years. Rae was also a very dedicated Club Treasurer for six years commencing in October 2012.


We admired Rae for continuing to attend club rallies after Jim passed away. We wish her all the best for the future. We will miss seeing Rae at our upcoming rallies.








This information should include any medical conditions, medications and In Case of Emergency (I.C.E.) contact/s.

This information can also be stored in your smart phone for access at any time or any place.




To access the Medical Information section on your smart phone, navigate to your Contacts List and locate Your name then Select it. This may need to be done through Settings on some phones.

Your details will now be displayed select **Edit** to start updating then scroll down until you locate **Edit Medical ID** (iPhone) or **Medical Info** (Android) or like then **Select.**

Now complete any appropriate sections e.g., Medical Conditions, Medical Notes (Medications), Blood Type & ICE (In Case of Emergency) contact/s. You will also need to scroll down to Emergency Access (iPhone) & select **Show When Locked**. then select **Done** or like to save.

This information can then be accessed if required by selecting **Emergency** from your Passcode screen. No passcode is required.



Rod's demonstration of being admitted to hospital was memorable to say the least along with some other great charades.


After a great deal of fun and laughter the competition stopped after an exhausting twenty-two rounds!




