## **Maleny Showgrounds**

#### Location and History:

Located high in the picturesque Blackall Range, Maleny is a hinterland town on the Sunshine Coast. From dairy cow country, it is interspersed with rainforests and sweeping views of the Glass House Mountains. It is also known for its many café and dining venues, sensational food and luxurious places to stay.

The first industry in the area was that of timber felling in the 1870s. Land clearing gave way initially to wooden box manufacturing and then to dairy farming and fruit growing. 1903 saw the introduction of the Maleny Butter factory. In the 2021 census, the locality of Maleny had a population of 3,959 people

#### Directions:

From the Bruce Highway take the Landsborough turn off and continue onto the Steve Irwin Way (State Route 6) and into Landsborough. From Landsborough it is 17km on the Landsborough Maleny Road (State Route 23) to Maleny township. Turn left into Coral Street/Maleny Stanley River Road and entry to the Showgrounds which is on the left.

#### Things to do during the rally......

- 1. Immerse your senses in a rainforest filled with plant and animal life overlooking the spectacular Glasshouse Mountains at the **Mary Cairncross Scenic Reserve** on 148 Mountain View Road. There are a couple of walks/loops of 1.3kms in this reserve namely Piccabeen Loop and Pademelon Loop. The reserve is 8-9kms south-east from Maleny
- 2. **Baroon Pocket Dam (**20 km north) is a picturesque lake tucked away between Montville and north Maleny. The shoreline is a paradise for bushwalkers and nature lovers. Hike through open forest ridges, cross bridges and boardwalks over tree-lined streams to Baroon Lookout. Take in the stunning views of the Obi Obi Gorge, Baroon Pocket Dam (popular for kayaking) and its catchment. The Martin Williams Track (a circular 3km walking track) is also popular with cyclists and mountain bikers.
- 3. **Botanical Gardens and Bird Aviary**, 233 Maleny Stanley River Rd, Maleny (There is a cost, \$20 for Seniors)
- 4. Maleny Cheese (1 Clifford Street) 10am-3pm is where you'll get to see the cheesemakers in action and enjoy tastings in the café and shop. You can also purchase outstanding hard and soft cheeses and products from the award-winning yoghurt range. For an extra cheesy finale, head to Maleny Food Co (29 Maple Street) and indulge yourself in the fromage featuring more than 200 cheeses from Australia and around the world. Breakfast and Lunch are available from the Café.

Canungra is tucked away in a valley between Mt Tamborine and Beaudesert. It is a very peaceful country town. The last time Yvonne and I attended a club rally



As the dog population in our club has increased recently, it might be timely to remind all members of Items 38 and 39 of the club's by-laws regarding pets, together with the committee's interpretation of clause (ii) of the same.

#### Dogs

- 38. The Peninsula Caravan Club Inc. welcomes quiet and obedient dogs.
  - a. Qualified Guide dogs, Hearing dogs & Support dogs any size.
  - b. Maximum number permitted per RV is two dogs.
  - c. However, members must ensure that when dogs are not in their RV they must be:
    - Under strict control and on a short leash at all times. (i)
    - (ii) Dogs are not permitted to be in attendance at the general gathering at morning and afternoon tea periods, happy hours and at meal time unless they are gualified Guide Dogs, Hearing Dogs, Support Dogs etc.

- (iii) All dog droppings must be picked up and properly disposed of immediately.
- (iv) Members must exercise consideration for fellow members by ensuring that any barking is addressed immediately.
- (v) Failure to adhere to these rules may result in termination of membership.

#### Other Pets

**39.** All other pets are welcome under the same rules as pertaining to dogs.

#### PCCI Dog By-Laws

Dogs are welcome at club rallies however there are some restrictions regarding gatherings which are contained in the following **by-law**:

Rule 38 C

(ii) of the By-Laws states "Dogs are not permitted to be in attendance at the general gathering at morning and afternoon tea periods, happy hours and meal times unless they are qualified Guide Dogs, Hearing Dogs, Support Dogs, etc.

This is interpreted to mean that pets should remain in the owners RV or be securely tethered some distance (3 metres) from these gatherings.

### Message from our Rally Co-Ordinator - Mick Self booking your Site at Yarraman





#### Members Medical Information

It has been recommended that members have a Personal Medical Record and details displayed in your RV to assist Ambulance staff etc. in case of an emergency.

This information should include any medical conditions, medications and In Case of Emergency (I.C.E.) contact/s.

This information can also be stored in your smart phone for access at any time or any place.

To access the Medical Information section on your smart phone, navigate to your Contacts List and locate Your name then Select it. This may need to be done through Settings on some phones.

Your details will now be displayed. Select **Edit** to start updating then scroll down until you locate **Edit Medical ID** (iPhone) or **Medical Info** (Android) or like then **Select.** 

Now complete any appropriate sections e.g., Medical Conditions, Medical Notes (Medications), Blood Type & ICE (In Case of Emergency) contact/s. You will also need to scroll down to Emergency Access (iPhone) & select **Show When Locked**. then select **Done** or like to save.

This information can then be accessed if required by selecting **Emergency** from your Passcode screen. No passcode is required.
