Location and History: Mudjimba is a coastal urban area between Coolum Beach and Maroochydore and is 100 km north of central Brisbane. It was named after Mudjimba Island, a well vegetated rocky islet about 2 km east of Mudjimba. The waters around Mudjimba Island (also known as Old Woman Island) have been a popular destination for surfers, divers and Fishers. In 1960 the fledgling settlement of Mudjimba had neither electricity nor piped town water (not until approx. 1970's). In 2005 the suburb of Twin Waters was created, reducing Mudjimba's area by about half, leaving it with the part of Maroochy River Conservation Park north of Ocean Drive. In 1996 the Mudjimba SLC was formed. With its wide open beach, Mudjimba attracts serious surfers in search of the perfect swell as well as holiday makers, couples and families.

Directions: (3 travelling suggestions)

Follow M1 north towards Nambour, exit 208 onto the Bli Bli Road then David Low Way then the Mudjimba Beach Road, turn right onto the Esplanade, turn right into Cottonwood Road and the Caravan Park on the left.

Follow the M1 northbound exit 194 for Sunshine Motorway (State Route 70) to David Low Way, then as above.

M1 northwards, exit 201 Maroochydore Road then Sunshine Motorway, etc.

Things to do during the rally......

- 1. **Ginger Castle at Yandina** Family owned business producing ginger products since 1941 with a range of snacks, condiments, beverages, health & wellness products and their famous ginger beer.
- 2. **Australia Zoo at Beerwah** fantastic conservation and wildlife park.
- 3. **Underwater World Sealife at Mooloolaba** is a marine mammal park, oceanarium and wildlife sanctuary.
- 4. **Maroochydore Cotton Tree Markets** at King Street from 7.00am each Sunday.
- 5. **Mooloolaba Sunset Markets** from 5.00pm—9:00 pm Saturday along the Esplanade.
- 6. **Eumundi Markets** each Wednesday and Saturday from 7.30am.
- 7. Caloundra Street Fair on Sunday mornings 8.00am.




PENINSULA CARAVAN CLUB INC

BY-LAWS

Membership

- 1. Potential applicants seeking to join the association must in the first instance advise the secretary of their intention.
- All potential applicants must attend two (2) recognised club rallies, with a Recreation Vehicle (RV) such as a Caravan, Campervan, Camper Trailer or Motorised Van, such attendances being within a period of six (6) months; and

 a) The management committee shall not determine upon the admission or rejection of any applicant, in accordance with constitution rule 7 (3), until the applicant has met with the required two (2) rally attendances.
- 3. Potential applicants will receive copies of the associations Constitution & By-laws on or prior to their first rally and Membership Application form on their second rally. They may submit their fully completed application on or after their second rally.
- 4. On signing the Application form the applicant/s agree to adhere to the club rules and code of conduct as contained in the current Constitution & By-laws.
- 5. In accordance with Constitution Rule 4 (2) the maximum number of member RVs shall be forty (40).
- 6. A member RV consists of up to two adults with both adults holding voting rights.
- **7.** Official Club Dress consists of Royal blue polo shirt, ivory stripes and embroidery. [Application rules 8 and 47 refer.]
- 8. The official Club Name Badge must be worn at club rallies on the official rally days of Saturday and at State and National Rallies and any other official events as required. [For club uniform application, rules 7 and 47 refer.]
- 9. The Secretary will ensure that the management committee consider an application for membership at the next committee meeting or prior to by email to be included in the next committee meeting minutes.
- 10. On acceptance/rejection of the application, the Secretary will advise the applicant in writing within 7 days after the committee meeting.
- 11. Successful applicants will be issued with a member RV number upon receipt of the appropriate fees.
- 12. Successful applicants are required to purchase an official club shirt.
- 13. Successful applicants will be inducted into the club by the President at the next club rally they attend and will receive:
 - Name badge/s
 - Club sticker
 - Member RV number
- 14. In circumstances where one person only is using a member RV and at a later date wishes to include a partner to the member RV, then the intended applicant must submit a Membership Application form in the normal manner.
- 15. The Secretary is responsible for maintaining the register of members required by Rule 10 of the Constitution. The Secretary may delegate this responsibility to another management committee member. Any changes to membership details are entered into the register. In addition, at least twice a year the Secretary will organise the updating of the club website Contacts List
- 16. Any ordinary Member who joins another Caravan Club may not continue membership of the Peninsula Caravan Club Inc.
- 17. A Member of another Caravan/RV Club will not be considered for ordinary membership of the Peninsula Caravan Club Inc unless the person presents a copy of their resignation letter and notification of acceptance from that club.
- 18. A Member (regardless of membership category) who has accumulated arrears of one month without having paid the renewal fee may cause their membership to be cancelled.

Members Medical Information

It has been recommended that members have a Personal Medical Record and details displayed in your RV to assist Ambulance staff etc. in case of an emergency.

This information should include any medical conditions, medications and In Case of Emergency (I.C.E.) contact/s.

This information can also be stored in your smart phone for access at any time or any place.

To access the Medical Information section on your smart phone, navigate to your Contacts List and locate Your name then Select it. This may need to be done through Settings on some phones.

Your details will now be displayed. Select **Edit** to start updating then scroll down until you locate **Edit Medical ID** (iPhone) or **Medical Info** (Android) or like then **Select.**

Now complete any appropriate sections e.g., Medical Conditions, Medical Notes (Medications), Blood Type & ICE (In Case of Emergency) contact/s. You will also need to scroll down to Emergency Access (iPhone) & select **Show When Locked**. then select **Done** or like to save.

This information can then be accessed if required by selecting **Emergency** from your Passcode screen. No passcode is required.
